Michigan State Fair

Earl Hoffman, Master Beekeeper and SEMBA vice president, will conduct a two-session queen-rearing workshop (June 5 and 12) at the E.L. Johnson Nature Center on Franklin Rd. in West Bloomfield Township.

The first session is Saturday, June 5<sup>th</sup> at noon, (lasting one hour or less) for orientation and payment

of \$20 per beekeeper for queen-rearing hand-outs and videos.

The second session is Saturday, June 12, 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. or longer, to review queen-rearing methods and conduct grafting using the Doolittle method. (It is suggested that each participant bring a lunch.) Queen grafting cups, frames and grafting tools will be for sale on June 12. The cost for tools is in addition to the workshop fee.

Ten days later, the students may either pick up queen cells or help put them in mating "Nucs". Earl says, "We may have some extra queens to sell by the 4<sup>th</sup> of July at \$5 each."

### **HONEY HOUSE REGULATION UPDATE**

You may recall that we were notified by the Michigan Department of Agriculture, Food and Dairy Division (MDA-FDD) that all beekeepers extracting honey must be inspected and licensed by MDA-FDD. In the March-April 2004 SEMBA Newsletter, we reported on the most recent developments in working with the MDA-FDD on honey house regulations.

A joint-committee of MBA and SEMBA members developed a proposal to exempt some beekeepers from the licensing requirement and also proposed guidelines for honey house regulations. This proposal was distributed to beekeepers throughout Michigan for information and suggestions. The MBA-SEMBA committee met again to consider these suggestions and finalized a proposal, which was then sent to the MDA-FDD.

We have received a counter-proposal from the MDA-FDD that the MBA-SEMBA committee reviewed at a meeting on May 12, 2004. MDA-FDD and members of the MBA-SEMBA committee will now draft a document that, hopefully, beekeepers will find fair and practical and insure the purity of honey for consumers.

### **BEEES AND FLOWER GARDEN AT THE ROUGE**

After an absence of almost 25 years, tours of the Rouge Ford Motor Company are being resumed. In addition to the tour of the F150

assembly plant, a special tour of the "Living Roof Garden" complete with a colony of honey bees is featured. SEMBA member David D'Agostino was instrumental in setting up the colony.

**SEMBA AND THE STATE FAIR**

The annual Michigan State Fair is coming early this year – AUGUST 11-22.

This is our yearly opportunity to explain to Metro Detroit-area folks what beekeeping is about and to talk about the importance of bees. We get a lot of questions such as, Do you ever get stung? Which one is the queen? How do you get the honey out? It really is a great chance to spread the word about bees, pollination and honey.

As you probably know, each year SEMBA has an educational display booth in the Agriculture Building which is staffed with two or three SEMBA members at a time. These volunteers hand out literature about bees, honey and recipes, answer questions, stamp bees on children's hands and talk about beekeeping. If we have several people scheduled for each time period, they can take turns getting a cup of coffee or looking at some of the fair exhibits. Personally, I like to visit the Michigan State Veterinary exhibit, the birthing tent, and sometimes get to see a calf or lamb being born.

We are asking all SEMBA members to volunteer to work a half-day period for one day during the fair– 9:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. or 2:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. Help is also needed for set-up on August 10<sup>th</sup> and for take-down on the 22<sup>nd</sup> or 23<sup>rd</sup>. SEMBA members working the booth are given free parking and free entrance passes.

## FROM HERE TO THERE

Nothing is so simple that it can't get screwed up. It takes about eight cells of honey and pollen to rear a bee from egg to adult. This could be an add for Bounce dryer sheets. I have never tried this. Put a sheet in your back pocket or tie a sheet through a belt loop when outdoors' during the summer to keep bee's, yellow jacket's, and mosquitoes' away. Around your pant legs may help repel ticks also. It will repel mice if spread around the foundation areas or in a trailer. This might even work in a honey house. Place

a sheet near an ant nest and it will chase them away. It helps take the odor out of books and albums that don't get opened very often, like your bee journals. A used sheet will collect sawdust like a tack cloth, help clean your liquid bees wax, and eliminate static electricity from your 'T V' screen. 'O' yes Joyce Guthrie told me this one. If bees are bringing in pollen, chances are they are queen-right.
